WHEREAS, For 50 years, Taller Puertorriqueño has continued to be a vital resource for progress in the Philadelphia Barrio and the region. It is now recognized as a model organization that uses the arts as a vehicle for social change. It is also the largest Puerto Rican/Latino-based arts and cultural facility in the state of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, The 50th Anniversary Gala will serve as a momentous occasion to recognize Taller Puertorriqueño's key milestones and honor the individuals and partners who have contributed to its success, while raising critical funds to ensure the future sustainability of its programming and outreach efforts; and
