RESOLUTION

Calling on Pennsylvania's Department of Public Welfare to continue the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) until all of its federally appropriated money is spent this year on helping low-income residents with their home heating needs.

WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare (DPW) administers LIHEAP, which consists of the following components: cash benefits given to low-income households for their home heating fuel; crisis payments to resolve weather related, supply shortage and other household energy emergencies, including immanent loss of heating due to inability to pay; and energy conservation and weatherization measures to address long-range solutions to home-heating problems faced by low-income households; and

WHEREAS, The Federal Government each year appropriates money for LIHEAP to Pennsylvania's Department of Public Welfare to distribute within various regions of the Commonwealth. For FY 2002-2003, the <u>Federal LIHEAP appropriation</u> for Pennsylvania was approximately \$136 million; and

WHEREAS, DPW began its LIHEAP services on November 12, 2002 and <u>it</u> is expected <u>that</u> their services <u>will close</u> on March 27, 2003; and

WHEREAS, For FY 2001-2002, DPW <u>closed the program having over</u> \$10 million <u>in unspent LIHEAP</u> money in their budget, which <u>carried</u> over into their FY 2002-2003 budget; and

<u>WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has received additional LIHEAP monies for use in this</u> <u>FY 2002-2003; and</u>

WHEREAS, Hundreds of thousands of low-income residents and seniors in Philadelphia have suffered through one of the <u>most severe</u>, winters, in the city's history and now face insurmountable energy bills and a loss of gas and electric heating service in a matter of weeks; and Deleted: stop Deleted: While DPW may decide to extend LIHEAP into early April, the state may still have a monetary windfall that it can carry over into next year's budget; Deleted: still had approximately Deleted: of Deleted: to Deleted: y
