THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Title 2 of The Philadelphia Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

TITLE 2. CITY-COUNTY CONSOLIDATION.

* * *

CHAPTER 2-200. RECORDING OF DEEDS.

§ 2-201. Definitions.

- (1) Commissioner. The Commissioner of Records.
- (2) Corporation. As defined in Section 19-1402 of this Code.
- (3) Deed. Any agreement in writing, that conveys, transfers, demises, vests, confirms or evidences any transfer or demise of title to real estate but not including wills, mortgages, deeds of trust or other instruments of like character given as security for a debt and deeds of release thereof to the debtor.
 - (4) Department. The Department of Records.

- (5) Real estate. As defined in Section 19-1402 of this Code.
- (6) Record owner. The person whose name last appears as the owner of record in the Department's records.
- (7) Sheriff's deed. A deed giving ownership rights in real estate to a purchaser at a sheriff's sale.
 - (8) Title insurance company. As defined in 40 P.S. § 910-1.
 - (9) Title to real estate. As defined in Section 19-1402 of this Code.
- § 2-202. Requirements. The requirements of this Section are in addition to any requirements provided by state law, local law or regulations promulgated by the Department.
- (1) No deed shall be recorded in the Department unless Upon presentation of a deed for recording, the Department shall perform a records check, conducted by the Department, verifies that to determine whether the named grantor on the deed matches is the record owner of the real estate identified therein, except in the following cases where the grantor may be a person other than the record owner:
 - (a) Any deed where the real estate described therein is part of a decedent's estate;
- (b) Any deed where the grantor has been issued power of attorney by the record owner; or
 - (c) Any deed where the grantor is a trustee.; or
- (d) Any deed where, pursuant to regulations promulgated by the Department, a grantor, other than the record owner of the real estate identified in the deed, may be appropriate.

In the event that there is no match, the Department shall take such steps as it deems appropriate to determine the reason for the discrepancy and to refer the matter to such other governmental agency as may be appropriate if the Department determines that the circumstances suggest the possibility that a fraud may have occurred.

(2) The following deeds shall not be recorded unless they are be accompanied by the appropriate additional documentation as set forth below:

- (a) Where the real estate identified in the deed is part of a decedent's estate, letters testamentary or letters of administration, issued by the Register of Wills shall be provided.
- (b) Where the grantor has been granted power of attorney by the record owner of the real estate identified in the deed, written documentation of the power of attorney, shall be provided.
 - (c) Where the grantor is a trustee, the writing creating the trust shall be provided.
- (d) Where the grantor is a corporation, documentation of the filing of Articles of Incorporation with the appropriate state agency shall be provided.
- (e) Where, under the regulations of the Department, the grantor may legally be someone other than the record owner of the real estate identified in the deed, the Commissioner shall determine the appropriate documentation to be provided.
- (3) Any deed delivered to the Department by mail through the United States Postal Service shall not be recorded unless it has been sent by registered or certified mail.
- (4) Within thirty (30) days of the recording of any deed, the Department shall notify the prior record owner of the real estate identified therein, by first class mail, that such deed has been recorded.
- § 2-203. Exemptions. The provisions of Section 2-202(1) through (3) of this Chapter shall not apply to sheriff's deeds or deeds presented for recording by or for any title insurance company, attorney or law firm.
- § 2-204. Regulations. The Department is authorized to promulgate such regulations as are necessary or appropriate to implement the provisions of this Chapter.

WHEREAS, the Philadelphia Municipal Authority (the "Authority") is authorized to design, build, finance, own, operate, maintain, and lease (either in the capacity of lessor and lessee) facilities and equipment, and provide related services, for the management of the City's wastewater treatment solids (collectively "Biosolids Services") on behalf of the Water Department or other designated City department; and

WHEREAS, the Water Department and the Procurement Department have requested that the Authority undertake a project (the "Project") to provide Biosolids Services for the City; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has selected Philadelphia Biosolids Services, LLC, through a competitive process, to provide Biosolids Services in accordance with a Request for Proposals issued on May 28, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the City, acting through the Water Department, has committed to the collective bargaining representative of Water department employees that the City shall not layoff, demote or otherwise impose any adverse employment consequences on such employees now assigned to the Biosolids Recycling Center as a result of the Project, absent just cause; and

WHEREAS, the Project will require the Authority to enter into an agreement with Philadelphia Biosolids Services, LLC for Biosolids Services, and will require the City and the Authority to enter into a Service Contract pursuant to which the City will assume certain obligations under the Authority's agreement with Philadelphia Biosolids Services, LLC; now therefore,

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. The Water Commissioner and the Procurement Commissioner, on behalf of the City of Philadelphia, are hereby authorized to enter into a Service Contract with the Philadelphia Municipal Authority ("Authority"), pursuant to which the City will assume certain of the Authority's obligations under an agreement the Authority will enter into with Philadelphia Biosolids Services, LLC to design, finance, build, own, operate and maintain facilities and equipment, and to provide operating services, for the management of the City's wastewater treatment solids ("Biosolids Services").

SECTION 2. The Service Contract authorized in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit "A" hereto, with such changes as (a) the City Solicitor deems necessary or desirable to protect the interest of the City, and which changes, in the legal judgment of the City Solicitor, do not materially alter the relationship of the parties to the Service Contract, directly or indirectly increase the City's financial obligations under the Service Contract, materially diminish the obligations of the Authority to the City under the Service Contract, or otherwise adversely affect the rights of the City or of any official of the City under the Service Contract, and (b) are necessary to conform the Service Contract to Sections 4 and 5 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. The authorization in Section 1 of this Ordinance is conditioned on the agreement between the Authority and Philadelphia Biosolids Services, LLC being substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit "B" hereto, with such changes as are consistent with any changes made to the Service Contract as authorized by Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. The City is not authorized to compensate the Philadelphia Municipal Authority (PMA) for Biosolids Services that are substantially similar to how the City operated the existing facility in Fiscal Year 2008, beyond a five year period from the commencement of the Service Contract. If at any time during the term of the Service Contract, a decision is made by PMA or the City to not complete the construction required in the Service Contract or to abandon use of the proposed heat-drying facility, the Service Contract shall be terminated no later than one year following the date of such decision. The Service Contract in Exhibit "A" shall be conformed to the conditions of this Section.

SECTION 5.
