WHEREAS, The NAACP Philadelphia ACT-SO 2023-2024 year rolled out an impressive and amazing slate of talented youth from across the City; and

WHEREAS, NAACP Philadelphia ACT-SO represented the City proudly winning ten gold medals at this year's ACT-SO competition in Las Vegas; and

WHEREAS, Two local medalists secured double gold, highlighting 10 Olympians across 12 categories at this year's competition; and

WHEREAS, Under the leadership of Chairperson Veronica Norris, the Philadelphia branch of the NAACP ACT-SO Program won three National Medals; and
