**WHEREAS**, He is the co-founder of the Charles Baker Memorial Summer League established in 1960, and the founder in 1968 of the “Sonny Hill Community Involvement League,” which continues to provide youth with discipline, guidance, and direction; and

**WHEREAS**, Professionally Hill has served in many interesting high level positions for the 76ers including; Executive Advisor to the Chief Operating Officer of the Wachovia Complex and as a commentator on there television broadcasts in the 1970’s; and

**WHEREAS**, Through his work and commitment in basketball as a player, coach, and owner of various teams he was named Who’s Who in Black America, Northeaster of the Year, and one of the 100 Most Influential Minorities by Sports Illustrated; and

**WHEREAS**, The Mannie Jackson - Basketball Human Spirit Award is given annually to an individual who has incorporated basketball into their efforts to contribute to the greater good of society; and

**WHEREAS**, Sonny Hill is still active in visiting, mentoring, and spending time with not only NBA players but on the streets of Philadelphia with young inspired basketball players; and

**WHEREAS**, It is the intent, that from this resolution Philadelphia will have undoubtedly acknowledged Mr. Sonny Hill has provided thousands of children an opportunity through his dedication and tireless efforts which has led to Philadelphia becoming one of the best basketball cities in the country; now, therefore, be it
