WHEREAS, Delta Sigma Theta Inc. is a private, nonprofit organization of over 195,000 predominately African American College educated women with more than 850 chapters located in the U.S., Japan, Germany, England, the Virgin Islands, Bermuda, Haiti, Liberia, the Bahamas, and the Republic of Korea; and

WHEREAS, Their major programs such as Sorority Economic Development, Educational Development, International Awareness and Involvement, Physical and Mental Health, and Political Awareness and Involvement are based upon the organizations' Five Point Programmatic Thrust; and

WHEREAS, The Sorors provide a cadre of public services through the Five Point Programmatic Thrust including voter registration and education, Adopt-A-School, Delta Habitat for Humanity, Delta Days in the State and National capitals, Delta Academy and Clinical Depression; and

WHEREAS, A Statewide Founders Weekend was held on Friday, January 19<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, January 21<sup>st</sup>, 2001 which was co-hosted by Philadelphia Alumnae, Valley Forge Alumnae, Quaker City Alumnae, and Chester Alumnae Chapters. The event, held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, celebrated the birth of the Sorority by its illustrious founders in 1913. More than 200 Sorors were in attendance; and
