Amending Chapter 10-700 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled "Refuse and Littering," by providing for additional penalties and consequences for short dumping, under certain terms and conditions.

*THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA HEREBY ORDAINS:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 10-700 of The Philadelphia Code is amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 10-700. REFUSE AND LITTERING.

\* \* \*

§ 10-719. Penalties.

\* \* \*

(4) The penalty for violation of Section 10-710(2) shall be:

\* \* \*

(c) such equitable remedy as the court may deem proper, including, without limitation, an order to clean up the location at which the violator dumped trash, garbage or debris *or to clean up other sites where short dumping has occurred* or to pay the costs of cleanup.

*(4.1) The Department of Licenses and Inspections may revoke the business privilege license of any person, for a period not to exceed one year, for a violation of Section 10-710(2). In making a determination regarding whether and for how long to revoke, the Department shall consider the recommendation of the enforcing agency, the willfulness of the violation and any past violations.*

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately.
