In 2003, she was then promoted to Captain and was reassigned to the 2nd District. After years of hard work and dedication she was promoted to Staff Inspector on May 5th, 2008 and was assigned to the Audit and Inspections Unit. Finally, on August 15th, 2013 Inspector Sonia Velazquez received her final assignment in the Philadelphia Police Academy Training Bureau and was assigned to the School District Office of School Safety; and
