Remembering the 10th Anniversary of the 2009 L'Aquila earthquake which occurred in the Abruzzo Region of central Italy.

WHEREAS, The City of Philadelphia formed a formal Partnership with the Region of Abruzzo, Italy in 1997; and

WHEREAS, The main shock of the L'Aquila earthquake occurred on April 6, 2009 at 3:32 a.m. Central European Time (CET) in the Abruzzo Region of central Italy and was rated at 5.9 on the Richter magnitude scale and 6.3 on the Moment magnitude scale; and

WHEREAS, The earthquake was felt throughout central Italy; 308 people are known to have died and approximately 1,500 people were injured making this the deadliest earthquake to hit Italy since the 1980 Irpinia earthquake; and

WHEREAS, There have been several thousand foreshocks <<https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Foreshock>> and aftershocks <<https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Aftershock>> since December 2008, more than thirty of which had a Richter magnitude of greater than 3.5; and

WHEREAS, The earthquake caused damage to between 3,000 and 11,000 buildings in the medieval <[https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Middle\\_Ages](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Middle_Ages)> city of L'Aquila <<https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/L%27Aquila>> and heavily damaged others including; the apse <<https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Apse>> of the Basilica <<https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Basilica>> of Saint Bernardino of Siena <[https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Bernardino\\_of\\_Siena](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Bernardino_of_Siena)>; almost the entire dome of the 18th-Century Church of Anime Sante <[https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Santa\\_Maria\\_del\\_Suffragio\\_\(L%27Aquila\)](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Santa_Maria_del_Suffragio_(L%27Aquila))>; the 13th-Century Basilica di Santa Maria di Collemaggio <[https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Santa\\_Maria\\_di\\_Collemaggio](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Santa_Maria_di_Collemaggio)>, which collapsed from the transept to the back of the church; Porta Napoli, the oldest gate to the city which was destroyed and the third floor of Forte Spagnolo <[https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Forte\\_Spagnolo](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Forte_Spagnolo)> as only some examples; and
