Recognizing June 4 through June 9, 2018 as Philly Real Estate Week in the City of Philadelphia and Celebrating Its Founder Nicole Purvy.

WHEREAS, The first annual Philly Real Estate Week ("PREW") will launch on June 4th, 2018 in the City of Philadelphia.
